


Rick Weaver Statement of Candidacy for Member Representative to WDIY Board of Directors

I am interested in the position of Member Representative to the WDIY Board of Directors at this time because I believe that I have the experience, skills, passion and now the time to make a positive contribution to WDIY and its Board of Directors.



A long-time supporter of WDIY and the LVCBA since the LVCBA's inception in 1983, I served as a programmer, genre coordinator, Board Secretary, Vice President and President of the LVCBA prior to our application for an FCC license. After our application, I rejoined the Board, serving on the Executive Committee as Vice President, where I was involved in negotiations with competing applicants.

Tasked with locating an appropriate site for the station, I then oversaw presentations of architectural plans for site renovations and selection of contractors and the resultant build out. I also solicited donated supplies and worked to organize volunteer work crews to lay carpets, wall coverings and painting. I was also involved in interviewing and hiring our initial staff.

I was one of the programmers who was on air during our live debut and have continued as an on-air programmer since then, first as a host of the "Drive Time" (which evolved into the Blend), and then as host of Celtic Faire to the present.

I went off the Board a couple years later, but became involved when we were in danger of losing our station to WLVT, rejoining the board for a few years until stability had been returned.

Other community involvement includes serving the Celtic Classic as a volunteer, Program Committee member and currently as a member of the Cultural Outreach Committee. I also have served as a volunteer at Godfrey Daniels, and have served as the Clerk of the Vestry at Trinity Episcopal Church for the past four years. Additionally, I am a member of Piper's Request, a traditional Irish/Celtic band that has performed in the area over the past 10 years.

I am interested in rejoining the Board in this capacity as I am currently semi-retired and am now able to devote the time to this venture that I believe it requires.

I feel that our volunteers and members are a valuable resource to WDIY, and as we grow and evolve as a station and community partner, we will need an engaged membership and active volunteers to achieve our full potential. Because I have served WDIY as a board member, programmer and volunteer, I am uniquely qualified to serve in this position and look forward to working with the board, staff and volunteers to help WDIY achieve its full potential.
